FOREST AND WINDBARRIER PLANTINGS IN THE UNITED STATES

Tree planting during the fiscal year 1956 (July 1, 1955 to June 30, 1956) as reported by various public agencies, principally the State Foresters, was as follows:

This is anew record--higher by nearly 103,000 acres than the previous record set in 1955.

Because of the increased supply of planting stock available, it is forecast that more than 1 million acres will be planted in 1957*

Planting types and ownerships

The Federal government planted 83,641 acres of forest and 2,319 acres of windbarriers in 1956 on lands administered by its various agencies* This is approximately 5,500 acres or 7 percent more than in 1955.

The States and other non-Federal public agencies planted 62,268 acres of forest and 195 acres of windbarriers. This is approximately 11,000 acres or 21 percent more than in 1955.

Private landowners planted 741,744 acres of forest and 25,261 acres of windbarriers, a total of 767,005 acres. This is about 86,000 acres or 13 percent more than in 1955 but the increase did not occur in all States, i. e.,

in 25 States private planting increased by 121,000 acres;
in 12 States private planting was approximately the same; and
in 13 States private planting decreased by 35,000 acres.

Forest planting

Eighty-four percent of the planting is being done on privately owned lands. Data for States in which private owners planted more than 20,000 acres are;

Reforestation by industrial organizations of their own lands amounted to 41 percent of the private land planting. In 1956 forest industries planted 256,938 acres, 17,910 acres more than in 1955; and other industries planted 46,139 acres, 6,510 acres less than in 1955. Data for States in which industry was especially active in reforesting its lands during 1956 are:

In many States the planting of industry-owned land would increase greatly if planting stock were more abundant. The number of forest-industry-owned nurseries has been increased each year in an effort to obtain more stock. Several additional ones will come into production in 1957.

Windbarrier planting

Windbarrier planting was reported from 34 States and amounted to 27,775 acres, classed as follows:

This is 3,974 acres less than was reported in 1955.

The need for windbarriers exists mostly on private lands and most of this type of planting is done there. Data for the States in which farmers and ranchers are most active in this form of tree planting are:

All other windbarrier planting 5,713 acres (20 percent)

Only South Dakota and Puerto Rico reported an increase in windbarrier planting. The overall decrease of 3,974 acres was due to drought in the Midwest, and to stock shortages in a few States.

It is estimated that nearly 3 million acres of new windbarrier plantings are needed, in addition to replantings in old, failing barriers. A sizable increase probably will occur during the next few years because of the following recent developments: (1) the Agricultural Conservation Program Service increase in the rate of cost sharing for tree planting in many States, (2) creation of a State forestry organization in two States, and strengthening of it in a third, (3) operation of the Conservation Reserve portion of the Soil Bank program, (4) activity under the Great Plains program authorized by Public Law 1021, and (5) increases in the supply of stock as a result of newly increased nursery capacities.

Nurseries—number, operators, and use of production

The only Federal nurseries operated in 1956 were 12 by the Forest Service and 1 by the Tennessee Valley Authority. Together they produced 141,850,000 trees, in comparison with 110,330,000 in 1955. Forest Service nursery trees went into a variety of programs--to National forests, lands of the Atomic Energy Commission, flood-control projects, and in a few States to private lands through the cooperative tree distribution programs (C-M4) of various States. Nursery stock from the TVA went to private lands through the established programs of that Agency.

The 1956 production of State nurseries was 580,884,000 plants in contrast to

the 1955 production of 519,462,000. The principal producers among the States were:

Ten States produced 72 percent of the stock; 31 States, Puerto Rico and Hawaii produced 28 percent, and 7 States did not operate nurseries but procured their stock from commercial growers, other States, or from Federal nurseries under special cooperative agreements.

Most of the state nursery production went to privately owned lands, largely through the C-M4 program. Texas and Minnesota each opened a new nursery, The Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources and the Connecticut State Park and Forestry Commission are each closing a nursery and building a new one. Two nurseries formerly classed as State in Michigan are now carried as county nurseries. Thus the number of State nurseries remains unchanged at 90. Florida, Washington, and Kentucky each seeded new nurseries from which the first output will be in 1957.

Most of the production from forest industry nurseries goes to Company lands, although some is distributed through a variety of Company programs to private landowners, often free or nearly free, for planting on their own lands. Five new forest industry nurseries began producing trees in 1956--2 in Washington, 1 in Florida, 1 in Louisiana, and 1 in Texas. Additional industry nurseries that will make their first shipments in 1957 are shown on the 1956 list of Forest Tree Nurseries in Minnesota, Michigan, and Florida. Not shown, but expected to produce their first stock in 1957, are nurseries of 2 land companies in Texas, and a land company and a paper company in Georgia. The production of the 20 forest industry nurseries was 77,307,000 trees in 1956 in contrast to 15 that produced 46,516,000 in 1955. The expected 27 nurseries might produce 110,000,000 or 120,000,000 trees in 1957.

The stock from the Soil Conservation District nurseries all goes to District cooperators. The 6 previously reported nurseries all continued in operation and produced 95 percent of their 1955 output.

The 53 commercial growers reported an output of 76,923,000 plants. The output of the 40 listed in 1955 was 57,000,000 plants. Between 3,000,000 and 4,000,000 of these were bought by the States for the C-M4 program. A great proportion of the remainder, possibly as much as 60 percent, is going into Christmas tree plantations.

Availability of stock

The State nurseries' production of 580 million plants in 1956 was far short of demand. Eleven States reported that their known unfilled orders amounted to 106 million trees, and 11 other States reported shortages but did not estimate the amount. There has been a shortage of stock since the close of World War II, despite a 900 percent increase in output in 12 years. Only 3 States reported production greater than needed for their own program, and they sold nearly all of this excess to adjacent States. With the interest in tree planting that existed during 1956, it is likely that State nursery production of at least 710 million plants would have been utilized. An even greater quantity will be needed for 1957 for these programs. New construction and additional sowings at existing nurseries are reported as under way to supply this increased demand.

In addition to the trees needed under the tree planting programs of 1956, there is now the new program of planting trees on some of the lands withdrawn from agricultural crop production. This planting will be done under the Conservation Reserve portion of the Soil Bank Program. It is anticipated that this program will require about 5 billion trees and shrubs. The peak annual output of trees for this program alone probably will be 1,000,000,000. Nursery development, including a few new nurseries, to produce Soil Bank stock is now under way in 34 States, and most of it will be completed before the fall of 1957. This is in addition to the development mentioned previously.

There will also be additional planting of commercial forest lands under Title IV of the Agricultural Act of 1956. The demand for stock for this program cannot yet be forecast.

The States' policies of giving priority to filling small orders have resulted in the large companies being unable to reforest their holdings at the rates they desire with trees from the State nurseries. Forest industry's demand is short of supply and more industry nurseries are being built each year. In 1949 there were 9 such nurseries, with a combined output of 8,400,000 trees. In 1956 there were 20 with an output of 77,307,000 trees, but this was inadequate to meet demand. At the present time 7 more industry-owned nurseries are under construction.

The commercial growers also reported a substantial increase in output. Fifty-three reported their production for 1956. Thirty-two of these are in Pennsylvania, Michigan, and Minnesota, and the balance are distributed over 12 other States. No commercial production was reported from 33 States.

Seed

The great expansion of nursery output now under way is, of course, requiring record quantities of seed and seed-collection facilities of private seed dealers and the States have been expanding rapidly. Although desirable seed is far from being abundant and cheap, the situation in general is not on such a hand-to-mouth basis as it was a few years ago. The nurseries have next year's seed in sight. Most of the States, and especially those with larger programs, have well-organized seed-procurement programs. Public agencies and private dealers have made considerable investments in equipment and seed stockpiles.

Programs to improve the genetic quality of seed are being vigorously pushed in several States by Federal, State, educational, and industrial agencies. Committees representing various agencies have been formed during the past few years in each principal forest region to coordinate this work and facilitate the exchange of current knowledge among the workers. Work is under way to develop trees with rapid growth, superior form, resistance to drought or to disease, or increased yield of specialized products such as maple syrup or naval stores. The variety and scope of all of the work in progress is too extensive to be outlined here; mention of it is made merely to point out that a great deal of splendid work is now under way.

The job done and to be done

The size of the job to be done, and our rate of progress towards restoring the final ultimate acre are impossible to measure definitely. Not all of the acres planted develop into satisfactory stands. Neither does the area in need of planting remain constant, because logging, fire, epidemics, natural seeding, and changing land values all add to or subtract from the plantable areas. Thus, a year-to-year balance with "debits," "credits," and "amounts forwarded," all neatly arranged as in a bookkeeper's ledger, is not possible with planting statistics. The best that can be done in this regard is to make periodic appraisals of the situation. An appraisal made in 1953 as a part of the study of the nation's timber resource shows the tree planting job to be done in continental United States at the beginning of fiscal year 1953 in the following tabulation:


